







Kennet Radio 'Ray of Hope' spotlights at Newbury Racecourse to raise money to buy laptops for disadvantaged local schoolchildren and highlight the hope generated by the launch of new Vaccination Centre.

For Immediate Release - 20 January 2021: The 'Ray of Hope' spotlights will be visible in the night sky across Newbury and Thatcham every Thursday between 6pm and 8pm. Launching on Thursday 21st January, the goal of the spotlights is to encourage the local community to donate to good causes and to highlight the hope brought to the local community by the new vaccination centre at Newbury Racecourse.

The recent launch of the vaccination centre at <u>Newbury Racecourse</u> brings a much-needed ray of hope to the local community in and around West Berkshire, but we shouldn't forget the thousands of local children who face having to complete their lessons online at home for weeks to come.

Greenham Trust's '<u>Laptops for Lockdown Learning</u>' appeal, hosted on its online crowdfunding platform, The Good Exchange, aims to give every disadvantaged child in the local area a laptop to help them learn under lockdown. Greenham Trust will match up to £250,000 of donations made to the appeal. Every £1 donated will be matched by the Trust, raising £500,000 to help schools buy laptops for disadvantaged children to use at home.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has shone a stark light on the gap in provision for families in lockdown, especially those with school-age children who do not have the devices they need to learn at home, and we must make sure this gap doesn't continue to grow" said Chris Boulton, CEO, Greenham Trust. "We believe that the charitable sector and local communities have a role to play to ensure that disadvantaged children do not fall through the cracks when it comes to receiving education during these difficult times."

The vaccination centre at Newbury Racecourse has been set up for the most vulnerable and elderly in the West Berkshire council area which includes Newbury and Thatcham, with a centre in Pangbourne serving residents in the east. The NHS will invite residents to attend for a vaccination and provide details of when and where to go. Please do not contact the NHS to request a vaccination or turn up at the site.
